

Consumer Rights Day is celebrated on December 24th in India. It is a day to recognize the rights of consumers and to raise awareness about consumer protection. The day is observed to mark the adoption of the United Nations Guidelines for Consumer Protection, which were adopted by the UN General Assembly on December 24th, 1985.



In India, Consumer Rights Day is celebrated to highlight the importance of consumer protection and to educate consumers about their rights and how to exercise them. It is also an opportunity for consumer organizations and advocacy groups to raise awareness about consumer issues and to lobby for stronger consumer protections.
